Even more poles fell in the second round, and only Meon Silver retained their faultless record, which made them outright winners! Meon Bronze and Meon Gold both finished on 12 faults, but the Gold team were slightly faster which put them in eighth place, with the Bronze team ninth. SUBSCRIPTION RENEWALS

Your renewal form was sent out last month. Many thanks to those who have sent them back already. If you are not one of them please remember to do so before the end of the month. This is particularly important if you are hoping to compete in one of the 2009 Area Qualifiers, as you will not be eligible if your subscription has not been paid.

ACCESS

Day-length in March increases rapidly, providing more opportunity to get out in the countryside and enjoy the Spring flowers, and, if we're lucky, some Spring sunshine. For many riders access to the countryside is constricted because of the fragmented nature of the bridleways network. We are always trying to improve this, and now have the newly published Countryside Access Plans to assist us. Around 1300 riders in Hampshire contributed to these, including many in our area, which is split between the Forest of Bere, South Downs and Solent. The challenge now is to put these plans into action, and we need the support of all of you to do this.

In the Forest of Bere area, Rookesbury Estate at Wickham has kindly offered to make footpaths 6 and 32, which run from Hundred Acres road across the A32 to the Meon Valley Trail into permissive bridleways, and the link to the disused railway line has been improved. Riders generally prefer circular routes, so I'd be interested to know if anyone has found a good way of incorporating this into a circuit?

A group is also working on a proposal to create a new bridleway on the old Botley-Bishops Waltham railway line. We have received a lot of support, but Bishops Waltham Parish Council is opposed to horses using this route. This is surprising as it was a petition by riders in this area which put this into the CAP originally. If you live in Bishops Waltham, please let them know what you think of their attitude.
